Since its beginning over a year ago, the True Up Initiative has used the voices of foster youth and alumni to shape its efforts to change the face of foster care in Kentucky. What started with youth focus groups, has now developed into a diverse Youth Advisory Council. During the past month, current and former foster youth rallied together for the cause, were interviewed, and joined the True Up Youth Advisory Council. While this group of leaders comes from a variety of backgrounds, they stand united in working to make positive changes for current and former foster youth. They also form a supportive network of youth who have been through the foster care system and understand the common challenges and opportunities that impact the lives of current and former foster youth.

This will be their first of many opportunities to advocate for current and former foster youth.
